

# The Four things You Can Do to Stop the Spread of Zebra Mussels\*

& Other Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS)

Zebra mussels, and other AIS, pose a real threat to our pristine northern waterways. Please do your part and follow these **four simple steps**:

### 1. When You Leave the Water

- **CLEAN** weeds, algae, animals and mud from your trailer, watercraft\*\*, engine and gear.
- DRAIN all water from your watercraft, motor(s) and live wells. Leave plugs out for travel.
- DRY watercraft, ropes and gear before entering another waterbody.



## 2. PULL YOUR PLUG(s)

• Transport your watercraft with the plug(s) out — this is the law!

## 3. DECONTAMINATE - IF NECESSARY

- When your watercraft has been in zebra mussel or AIS invaded waters (e.g. Lake Winnipeg, Lake Manitoba, Nelson River, Footprint Lake, Cedar Lake) or within a "Control Zone", you must have your watercraft decontaminated - provincial legislation is in effect.
- Decontamination is available at government watercraft inspection stations free of charge.
